


# **VENUE LOCATION & PARKING**

Thackray Medical Museum is next to St James's Hospital in Leeds, two miles from the city centre and easily reached by road and public transport. Leeds is the nearest train station. Frequent bus services run from Leeds city centre and numbers 16, 42, 49, 50, and 50A all stop outside the museum. If travelling by road via the M621, follow the signs for York (A64) then follow the brown tourist signs. From the north, take the A58 towards Leeds, and then follow the brown tourist signs.

Parking is through the museum gates and immediately outside the museum. Yorkshire Funders Forum delegates can park all day for £4.00. Please pay as normal at the machine by cash or card and obtain an EXTENSION PERMIT from the museum reception to display in your vehicle.
